Scenario #1

A friend from English class approaches you during a school field trip. Your friend is trying to convince you to cover for him while he sneaks off to have a smoke. Select two people in your group to act this scenario out.

Scenario #2

You notice two students teasing a third while you are at your internship site. Your advisor is not around, and your site mentor has not yet noticed the behavior. What should you do? Select four people in your group to act this scenario out. Have two teasing friends, one unfortunate victim, and one person in a moral quandary.

Scenario #3

You are angry at your site mentor for giving a good project to a fellow student you do not like. What should you do? Select three people for this scenario. One person plays the excited mentor, one the chosen pupil, and last the dejected student.

Scenario #4

You are at a library during a school trip to find research materials. You notice a group of your friends snickering while reading a book, so you approach. Your three friends have found a book that is inappropriate for school and unrelated to the research assignment. What should you do? Select four people for this scenario. One member of the group is leading the other two, one is just trying to fit in, and the last member of the group is unaware that anything is wrong. The last person in the scenario is you, confused and irritated that you have been forced into this position.

Scenario #5

While visiting a park's educational center, you become inspired to write your name on the bathroom stall wall. Another student comes into the bathroom and notices your handiwork. How would you respond to this scenario? Choose two people for this scenario. One a bold, misdirected artist, and the other a surprised student.

Scenario #6

While hanging out with friends, you notice two friends are having a discussion about class. They are criticizing a teacher's assignment and are not happy about the work that they are required to do. What do you do? For this scenario, select three group members. One group member plays a failing student complaining about another assignment, another needs passing grades to be able to play on the sports team, and the third is a high achieving student.
